CLAIMING OUR POWER, RESILIENCE, AND LIBERATION


Founded and led by the Black Mamas Matter Alliance (BMMA), the Black Maternal Health Conference (BMHC) is the premiere assembly for Black women, clinicians, professionals, advocates, and other stakeholders working to improve maternal health using the birth justice, reproductive justice, and human rights frameworks. This year's virtual conference will offer a national space for learning, rich discussions, and mobilization to transform Black maternal health, rights, and justice. We need a place to be in community together, to vision and dream, and to celebrate each other.

Dorothy E. Roberts is an American scholar, public intellectual, and social justice advocate. She writes and lectures on gender, race, and class in legal issues. Her concerns include changing thinking and policy on reproductive health, child welfare, and bioethics. Dr. Roberts joined us for an interactive live discussion to offer a national space for learning, rich discussions, and mobilization to transform Black maternal health, rights, and justice.

Attendance and Participation

The Black Maternal Health Conference 2021 had an 89.6% participation rate on the virtual platform. The individuals that attended represented 38 different states with the largest number of attendees from the state of California, Georgia right behind at 33%, and subsequently followed by New York at 24%. From the 93 recorded sessions, there were 19,338 views and 7,911 favorites selected. The two live sessions drew 940 attendees on Friday, April 16th, and 683 attendees on Saturday, April 17th for a total of 9,922 hours of online engagement.


