

SOWING SEEDS OF CHANGE BLACK MATERNAL HEALTH INCUBATOR HUB™ TAKES ROOT

In direct response to the gap in skilled perinatal, maternal, and reproductive health providers serving Black communities in the nation, *BMMA launched the Black Maternal Health Incubator Hub™* (*BMH-IH*) in 2023. Through intentional assessment and community feedback, we crafted a pilot program focused on *inclusive perinatal care*, *addressing the needs of marginalized populations often overlooked in traditional healthcare settings*. We are grateful for seed funder Pritzker Children's Initiative and donors and sponsors like you. Your support of BMH-IH provided essential training and skill development for healthcare professionals.

The number of applications for this initiative highlights the immense need for Black Maternal Health workforce development. We received over <u>560 applications</u> nationwide from clinicians, nurse practitioners, and maternal and reproductive health service providers and organizations, all eager to contribute to improved birth outcomes for Black mothers.

Black Mamas Matter: In Policy and Practice Policy Agenda: Over a thousand registrants joined BMMA's Policy Day Virtual Rally to celebrate the official release of "Black Mamas Matter: In Policy and Practice," our comprehensive policy agenda. The rally featured influential leaders like Senator Cory Booker, Representatives Alma Adams, Gwen Moore, and Lauren Underwood, alongside representatives from various national partners who amplified key areas of BMMA's policy agenda.

Stemming from the Black Maternal Health Caucus, and in collaboration with BMMA partners nationwide, this agenda addresses six overarching policy issues crucial for Black Maternal Health, ranging from structural and social determinants to leadership empowerment. The policy agenda has already begun shaping the discourse around Black Maternal Health, informing advocacy efforts and legislative initiatives.

OUR MISSION

BMMA is a Black women-led cross-sectoral alliance that centers Black Mamas and birthing people to advocate, drive research, build power, and shift culture for Black Maternal Health, rights, and justice.



Pregnant Workers Fairness Act: BMMA worked in tandem with Better Balance to advocate for the passage of the Pregnant Workers Fairness Act, alongside a powerful coalition of national advocates. This legislation addresses the economic insecurity that disproportionately affects Black pregnant workers. By ensuring reasonable accommodations for pregnant workers in the workplace, the Pregnant Worker Fairness Act empowers Black women to prioritize their health and well-being during pregnancy, ultimately leading to better birth outcomes for themselves and their babies.

BLACK MIDWIFERY CONVENING IGNITED A POWERFUL MOVEMENT

In collaboration with the Center for Reproductive Rights, BMMA hosted the Black Midwifery Convening. This historic event brought together **50 Black midwifery** leaders from **19 different states** to address systemic barriers and advocate for policy reform.
