About **BMMA & BMHW26**



BMMA, Inc. (Black Mamas Matter Alliance) is a **network of Black-led and Black women-led organizations and multidisciplinary professionals** whose work is deeply rooted in reproductive justice, birth justice, and the human rights framework. Our mission is to ensure that all Black Mamas have the rights, respect, and resources to thrive before, during, and after pregnancy — bringing together midwives, OB/GYNs, nurses, doulas, birth workers, lawyers, academics, artists, and public health researchers working to END maternal mortality.

BLACK MATERNAL HEALTH WEEK 2026

Black Maternal Health Week (BMHW) is an annual week-long campaign founded by BMMA in 2018, held each April during National Minority Health Month. The week opens on April 11 in recognition of the International Day for Maternal Health and Rights. BMHW26 marks the 9th year of the campaign, falling within BMMA's 10th anniversary of establishing the Global Black Maternal Health Movement.

The 2026 theme, "**Rooted in Justice & Joy,**" honors the fullness of this movement, the fight for structural change and accountability, and the healing, cultural traditions, and community care that have always sustained Black families. **Justice and joy are not separate. They are the roots of everything we do.**

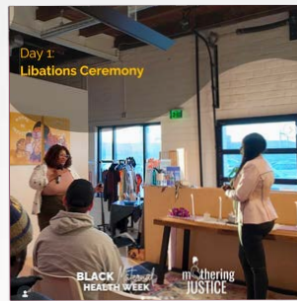

BMHW26 PROGRAMMING

ROOTED IN JUSTICE & JOY!

Saturday, April 11 — Black Maternal Health & Birth Justice Across Regions — Virtual In recognition of the International Day for Maternal Health and Rights, this program brought together Black maternal health and birth justice advocates from across the global diaspora to reflect on the movement's growth and the shared work happening in communities worldwide.

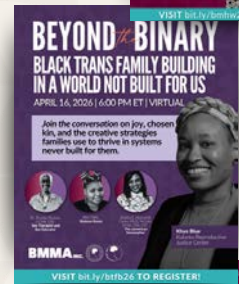
Saturday, April 11 — The Black Maternal Health WALK & COMMUNITY FAIR, Atlanta, GA A community-centered day bringing together Black mamas, families, birth workers, and advocates for a morning walk followed by family-friendly activities, food, live entertainment, and community resources — all rooted in this year's theme of justice and joy.

Monday, April 13 — BMH In Your Neighborhood Virtual Pep Rally — Virtual This community-centered kickoff connected Alliance partners and stakeholders from across the country leading work in their communities, with a focus on how to get involved locally and nationally in advancing Black maternal health equity.

Wednesday, April 15 — BMH Professionals' Networking Event, Atlanta, GA An exclusive gathering during BMHW26 for doulas, midwives, maternal health advocates, medical professionals, and community organizers to connect, share knowledge, and build collaborations that advance Black maternal health.

Thursday, April 16 — Beyond the Binary: Black Trans Family Building in a World Not Built for Us — Virtual This conversation centered how Black trans families build, protect, and sustain themselves within systems not designed for their existence — highlighting joy, chosen kin, and the strategies families use to navigate policy, surveillance, and erasure.

Friday, April 17 — Community Remembrance and Healing Vigil, Atlanta, GA An intimate gathering to honor Black families lost to maternal mortality and hold space for grief, remembrance, and renewal — with ritual elements including foot washing, affirmation showers, and community altar building.

POLICY & ADVOCACY IN ACTION

BMHW26 continued to build momentum at the state and local levels, with **9 states** and **5 cities** and **counties** issuing official resolutions and/or proclamations recognizing the week. States included **Vermont, Georgia, Pennsylvania, Illinois, New York, Michigan, Delaware, Louisiana, and Tennessee**. Cities and counties recognizing BMHW26 included **Denver, CO; Pasadena, CA; Anne Arundel County, MD; and the City of Toronto, Canada**, marking the first time the campaign received international recognition through a formal proclamation. The **New York City Department of Health** also publicly celebrated BMHW26, reflecting the campaign's growing reach across major urban centers.

A notable milestone this year was the introduction of the BMHW resolution in the Georgia House for the first time, continuing the state-level legislative momentum building around Black maternal health. To support advocates nationwide, BMMA made its **BMHW State Resolution Template Guide** available as a resource, **downloaded more than 190 times**.

At the federal level, the BMHW26 resolution was championed by **Congresswoman Alma Adams, Congresswoman Lauren Underwood, and Senator Cory Booker**, with **81 organizations and individuals signing on** in support.

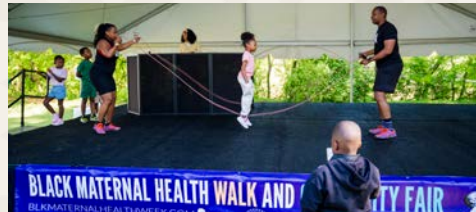

2026 BLACK MATERNAL HEALTH WALK & COMMUNITY FAIR

This year, BMMA, Inc. presented the **2026 Black Maternal Health WALK & COMMUNITY FAIR** at Candler Park, Atlanta, GA — a community day rooted in connection, care, and collective joy. The day drew 645 registrants and 320+ attendees.

The day opened with a mini pep rally before the walk, with Justice and Joy Captains leading the charge and bringing the energy that carried the morning forward. Their leadership also supported BMMA's BMHW fundraising effort, with funds raised supporting BMMA's year-round work.

Following the walk, attendees took part in a full lineup of activations, including free health screenings and resources, yoga, face painting, children's storytime, and line dancing. In the Mama's Village, 15 community-based organizations and Alliance partners tabled alongside merchants, offering resources, products,



and community connection throughout the day. Attendees had access to food and giveaways throughout the event.

Now in its second year, BMMA's **Black Maternal Health Professionals' Networking Event** returned during BMHW26 as a dedicated space for professionals across the field to connect, share knowledge, and strengthen the Black maternal health network



Held on Wednesday, April 15 in Atlanta, GA, the evening brought together doulas, midwives, maternal health advocates, medical professionals, researchers, and community organizers, with giveaways and prizes adding to the celebration of the people doing this work every day.

HONORING BLACK MAMAS, CENTERING BLACK BIRTH WORKERS



As BMHW26 drew to a close, BMMA gathered in Atlanta for an intimate space dedicated to honoring Black families lost to maternal mortality and affirming the healing and joy that sustains this movement.



The **'Honoring Black Mamas, Centering Black Birth Workers: A Community Remembrance and Healing Vigil'** was designed specifically for those who carry the weight of this work — birth workers, doulas, midwives, nurses, physicians, public health professionals, and lactation consultants. Participants engaged in ritual elements including foot washing, affirmation showers, and community altar building, collectively holding space for grief, remembrance, and renewal.

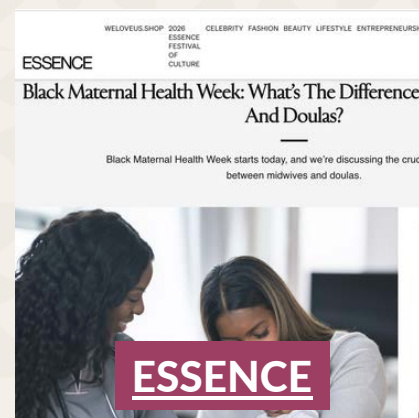
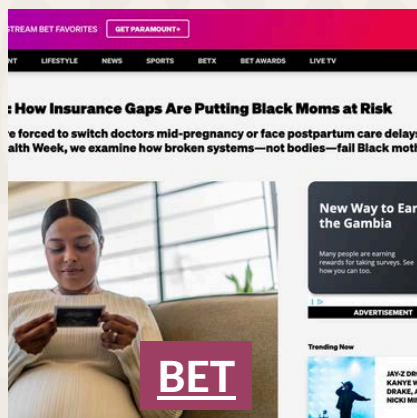


This campaign reached communities across the country and globe, uplifted Black-led organizations, and continued the call for Black maternal health, rights, and justice.
